## Modernizing Schools for Continued Academic Excellence

Some Alta Loma School District schools are now over 50 years old, and many need to be brought up to the same standards as newer schools. Roofs are beginning to need replacement, outdated electrical systems will not support current technology standards and portable classrooms need to be replaced with permanent buildings. To meet current academic and safety standards, our schools need to be modernized and upgraded.



## Local Funding for Student Success

In order to maintain modern schools and promote a high-quality education, the Alta Loma School District Board of Trustees voted to place Measure H, a \$58 million bond measure, on the November 8, 2016 ballot to update local schools. If passed, Measure H would:

- Update instructional technology in the classroom for improved student learning in core subjects like reading, math, science and technology
- Repair or replace deteriorating roofs, plumbing, electrical and air conditioning systems where needed
- Improve student safety and campus security systems, including security lighting, security cameras, fencing, emergency communications systems, smoke detectors, fire alarms and sprinklers
- Improve access and educational facilities for students with disabilities and special medical needs

## Strict Fiscal Accountability

- All money raised by Measure H would stay local to support our students and could not be taken away by the State
- A Citizens' Oversight Committee and independent audits would be required to ensure all funds are spent properly
- Measure H would make the District eligible for millions of dollars in state matching funds that would otherwise go to other communities
