

Measure H Update January 2018

Wireless infrastructure upgrades at all 10 Alta Loma School District campuses were completed in December, marking the culmination of the first major project financed with funds from the successful 2016 Measure H Bond initiative.

The network improvements will provide additional access points at each campus so that entire classrooms can log on to the wireless network simultaneously without a reduction in performance. This includes times when computers or devices are viewing video content, which consumes more bandwidth than documents or other smaller files.

Bids will soon be accepted for the District-wide access control project. A keyless locking system will be installed on every door at every location throughout the district, improving security and overall control over how school classrooms are locked and unlocked. The SALTO Wireless Access Control System utilizes the latest in access control technology and the District's newly improved Wi-Fi infrastructure to operate locally at each room or centrally from school offices.

[WLC Architects, Inc.](#) of Rancho Cucamonga and [GO Architects Inc.](#) of Upland have submitted modernization plans to the Division of the State Architect for building and renovation projects at ALSD school sites. After those plans are reviewed at the state level, the District will be in line for approximately \$20 million in additional matching funds from the State of California. The matching funds will be made possible through the 2016 passage of Proposition 51. The Alta Loma School District became eligible for the matching state funds after Measure H was passed.
