ARRIVING AT SCHOOL

- Drop-off along Lemon Ave
- No drop off in the parking lot
- Bus lanes are for buses only
- Students must remain on sidewalks; no walking through the parking lot
- ► All students enter through the front gate in between the school office and the MPR on the south side of campus.



ARRIVING AT SCHOOL

- ► Students <u>are not to be on campus</u> <u>until 7:40</u> as there is no supervision until then.
 - Exceptions: Students who have
 "0" Period or those having
 breakfast in the MPR.
 (Breakfast starts at 7:30)
- Students are to remain in the upper blacktop (6th), quad (7th), or amphitheater (8th) until the 7:55 am bell rings.



- Students should be in their seats by 8:00am
- Explore/Hang Time is available before school hours if needed.

LUNCHTIME AT THE JUNIOR HIGH

- There will be two lunches: 6th & 7th; 7th & 8th
- Students have the entire lunch to eat their food.
- Lunchtime is an opportunity for kids to socialize with peers, attend clubs, participate in Noon Sports, or hang out on the East Field with friends.
- Of course, if a student hasn't finished eating, they may finish. A student will never be denied a lunch.





LUNCH

- Each day, we have multiple lunch windows open with a variety of entree choices.
- Lunch windows are located inside the MPR or on the west side of the Amphitheater stage
- Additional lunch carts are available on the side of the Amphitheater stage and by the Student Window.







School Dismissal is at 2:15 pm Daily Students should be off campus by 2:25 pm

- Students are encouraged to go directly home after school

THE 6TH GRADE EXPLORATORY WHEEL









Students will explore all four of these topics within their cohort during the year:

- STEM: Students will work on geometric art, STEM design/art, and science projects.
- PERFORMING ARTS: Students will be participate in drama, plays, storytelling and readers theater.
- ► COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will learn coding and robotics.
- DIGITAL ARTS: Students will learn digital editing, photography, website design and painting/sketching.

7TH GRADE ELECTIVES



CHORUS: Learn how to sing, read music, and work closely with a team of people. Students prepare a repertoire of songs for several required performances, including two evening concerts and opportunities to sing for school and community groups.



BAND: ALJH offers several bands for students interested in learning to play or develop their skills on their chosen instrument. Students will learn and perform various genres of music for evening concerts, school activities, and community events.



YEARBOOK: Utilizing digital technology, students will create the annual Yearbook while learning to design pages, select and crop pictures, write and edit copy, create headlines, and meet deadlines.



INTRO TO SPANISH: This course serves as an introduction to foreign language study, seeking to introduce and familiarize students to the Spanish language.

THE EXPLORATORY WHEEL







Students will be placed in 2 of the classes for a period of 18 weeks each.

- ► STEM: Students will work in our state of the art STEM Lab in hands on, high tech, exciting and engaging Expeditions including titles such as Building Bridges, Dragster Design, Fueling the Future, Making Waves, Rolling Robots, Urban Wind Farm, Contraptions, and more.
- ► CREATIVE ARTS: Students will be introduced to the Visual Arts, develop their artistic skills, and expand their creative potential while completing a variety of projects utilizing diverse media and modalities.
- COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will be introduced to core concepts of computer science including computing systems, networks and the internet, data and analysis, algorithms and programing, and the impacts of computing.

7TH/8TH GRADE PHYSICAL EDUCATION

*Clothes are not required for 6th grade students

- PE Shirts and PE Shorts can be purchased at Glimpse, Schedule Pickup, or from the Student Store.
- Tops are \$12 each, shorts are \$12
- PE clothes can only be worn during PE; students must change into street clothes after PE activity.
- Students who do not have their PE clothes will be required to wear loaners and grades may be impacted.
- Students do not need locks; they are built into the lockers.



G.A.T.E./ Honors

- 7th & 8th grade G.A.T.E./Honors students will be placed in Accelerated Language Arts and Accelerated Math if criteria is met.
- 6th grade students will have rigorous and differentiated instruction within each subject area.



Students in 6th-8th grade will have the opportunity to participate in extracurricular/enrichment GATE Activities.



Statewide organization to promote and recognize high standards of student scholarship, service, and citizenship

Qualifications:

- Based on state bylaws, only 7th & 8th grade student may participate.
- Minimum of <u>8 points in the 4 academic classes</u> (ELA, Math, Social Studies and Science)
- Points are calculated by: A = 3 pts B = 1 pt
- Students may <u>not</u> receive any <u>Ds or Fs</u> on their trimester report card. Students may <u>not</u> have <u>Ns or Us in their citizenship grades on their report cards.</u>
- ▶ 7th grade students may apply for CJSF at the end of the 1st trimester
- \$2.00 membership fee for each trimester.

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

In order to participate in the Promotion Ceremony students must have a <u>Cumulative GPA of 1.6 or higher!</u>



TDAP / VARICELLA VACCINES

► Effective July 1, 2011, Assembly Bill 354 requires all California students in grades 7 through 12 receive the Tdap booster vaccine and 2 Varicella vaccinations

Students will not receive class schedules if proof of these immunizations are not on file with the school



Annual Registration Forms through Infinite Campus

- Infinite Campus online registration must be completed for each student.
- Forms will be pushed to portal accounts in early July.
- Parents will need to set up a <u>Parent Portal</u> <u>account on Infinite Campus</u> (if not already registered) and fill out the information required.
- Online forms must be filled out before picking up class schedules.
