Technicians with Integrated Pest Management Services conduct monthly site visits to inspect and replace sticky traps, apply pesticides as needed to treat infestations of ants, spiders, waterbugs, and roaches, and inspect and treat any additional reported pest or rodent infestations. A comprehensive list of EPA registered pesticides used on our sites is available on the ALSD website. Each site posts the required notification to apply these pesticides, with postings going up 24 hours in advance and remaining for an additional 48 hours following the application.
